Kylie Morgan to Headline Inaugural *Goin' West Music Fest* at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum

Kylie Morgan has quickly proven herself to be a relatable storyteller and an engaging live performer. The Oklahoma native is known for baring her soul in her confessional lyrics and leaving her heart on the stage. At 14, she began touring full-time and hasn't slowed down, checking off bucket-list appearances including her Grand Ole Opry debut and a successful first-ever headlining tour. She performed at Nissan Stadium for CMA Fest, has taken the stage at major festivals, and just wrapped being on the road with Old Dominion for her first arena trek on the band's *No Bad Vibes Tour*. The CMT Music Awards-nominated "If He Wanted To He Would" hit country radio's Top 40 and helped set the stage for Kylie's current headlining tour, the *Making It Up As I Go Tour*. The EMI Recording Artist's music has amassed nearly 400 million streams. Kylie's current single "Two Night Stands" is available everywhere now.
